FROM THE DEACON CHAIR.....



Friends,

The season of Thanksgiving gives me an opportunity to give thanks for all of you and the faithful stewardship of your time, talents and treasure. I am thankful for the wonderful sermons we are hearing from our new pastor, for the continuing beautiful sound of music from our music ministry and the thoughtful, diverse opportunities for learning, serving, and growing spiritually together.

Your deacon body met on Monday, Nov. 12, and addressed several issues for consideration and affirmation. We voted to present Kristin Belcher to the congregation as our permanent Associate Pastor to Families, thereby removing the "interim" piece that has been in place for several months. Kristin brings a strong theological background as well as impressive organization and strategic planning skills. Our parents, children, and youth are excited to affirm Kristin in this role, as are your deacons.

The personnel committee shared the decision to fill the vacated position of administrative assistant in the office. Kevin has received well over 40 resumes and has narrowed the search to three individuals whom the personnel committee will consider. It is the hope and the plan of the personnel committee to have that person in place by December 1, just in time for the very busy Advent season. The committee also will begin a trial period of Friday office closing. This will allow us to present a more attractive part time package to the new administrative assistant position and reduce the number of volunteer positions that need to be filled. The church, of course, will be open and Kevin will be in the office working on sermon preparation. The committee is also working to install a new phone system which will allow greater security as well as forwarding capability to our ministers.

The deacons approved a proposal to move the yearly ministerial housing allowance claim for the IRS to the personnel committee to handle along with their work on the yearly benefits package. This will streamline the process of bringing it first to the deacons for approval and then to the congregation for approval. The deacons and congregation, will, of course, be apprised of any changes made to the housing allowance.

I give thanks to Reba Cobb for writing our latest proposal to the Gheens Foundation. The request of \$41,370 was submitted Nov. 15 for the replacement of the mechanical relays and electro-pneumatic switches as well as all coupling and switching functions and additional features that maximize the capability of the organ by upgrading the control system. Assisting Reba throughout this process were Robin Riddle and Robert Gammon. Janet Hymer worked to learn the process in order to prepare for writing the next grant.

The deacons approved the budget presented by the finance committee and when you read this, you will also have had an opportunity to review and approve the budget. Our increase in stewardship has allowed us to allocate funds to programs that had been operating under reduced funding for 2018. The finance committee will continue to monitor income and expenses throughout the year, making adjustments and recommendations to the church as needed.

I want to thank Charlie Baker for his work on our church security assessment that he did in early 2018. Recommendations to the deacons have been implemented. These include the closing of the perimeter doors on Sunday's at 11:00 with access only through the front sanctuary doors. The door on the left side of the sanctuary from the outside has been replaced with a crash bar door allowing us to lock that door during the service.



We are working on bids for security cameras to be installed at 8 strategic locations around the building and your deacon offering coordinators are seated in the Narthex with radios during the 11:00 service. Charlie recently attended a session offered to churches by the LMPD and earlier this year I attended a session on church security offered by Southeast Christian Church. The measures we have taken and are taking have all been consistently recommended through both trainings.

I know we all give thanks for the work of the nominating committee and the many members who have agreed to serve in the coming year. I look forward to serving with our new deacons and give thanks to Mark Riddle, Teri Veal, and Steve Naiser who will serve as the deacon officer selection team. They will present an officer slate to the deacons for approval at the December meeting.

We continue to fellowship with great joy, grieve for but celebrate the life of our beloved members whom we have lost this year, pray for and support all those who are facing difficult days, and join hands in love and with thanksgiving for all our Lord's many blessings.


It is impossible to find large enough words to fully express my deep appreciation for the
