# A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR



When I was little, my mom instituted a sacred rule starting annually after Halloween: nothing but essentials until Christmas. The indulgence of a trick-or-treating sweet-tooth was tempered by learning to patiently wait for the advent of the Christ child. If I saw a game or toy I wanted, my mom would gracefully remind me, "Wait until Christmas. This season is about giving not getting." Mary Lou was, as per usual, correct.

While we did not observe Advent in my little Southern Baptist church (I wasn't introduced to the Liturgical Calendar until college), I believe my mom still successfully taught us the most important lesson of this season which Winston Churchill expressed well:

"We make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give."

At Broadway this Advent, we will be learning about our mission partners and how our giving blesses lives all year long. Christmas brings a spike in charitable giving and awareness in our culture, but as a church of Jesus Christ our gestures of generosity and justice are bound to no single season. Advent is traditionally a preparatory season in the Church Calendar. Like Lent prepares us for Easter, Advent is a time to reflect on the "not-yet-ness" of our faith and the call to continue to labor faithfully in our love for God and for neighbor. During this season of Advent we will be reflecting on how what the Gifts of Advent look like through the eyes of our mission partners.
