Beloved Broadway,

Each Advent, we wait for the arrival of the Christ Child on Christmas who is the True Light coming into the world. We have become very familiar with waiting and longing this year. The old expression, which speaks to the impatience of children waiting for the holidays, "Moving slower than Christmas," has taken on new meaning for me in 2020. I cannot count the number of conversations I have had with our church family filled with longing, tears, and yearning to conclude this season of COVID. We long for the hugs, kisses, opportunities to sit in each other's homes, and to gather in our sacred spaces and sing until our diaphragms ache and our cups runneth over. This night of Pandemic seems impossibly long.

Last Saturday, I was given the task of "blacking out" our nursery and bedroom to prevent lil' Hank from reverse sleep cycling (terrifying words for new parents). Not being a professional window dresser, I took black garbage bags and black duct tape to cover the sky lights in the nursery (it doesn't look as bad as it sounds, but it doesn't look great either). After I finished covering the windows, it was after 5:00, so the sun was well on his way to bidding us farewell. I switched off the lights in the room to check my work. Even at early evening, there were still a few pin pricks and slivers of light breaking through the black plastic. I couldn't help but remember that Leonard Cohen lyric, "There is a crack, a crack in everything, That's how the light gets in." I felt a deep sense of comfort realizing, no matter how unimaginably dark the night, the littlest bit of light will find its way through. Gabriel says this to Mary this with more eloquence and brevity in Luke 1:37, "For nothing is impossible with God."


This Christmas Eve, we will continue to worship together as we have throughout the Pandemic but with two opportunities:


