FROM OUR PASTOR

In the summer of 2016, I began my studies in the Doctor of Ministry program at Baylor University. Our first seminar was two weeks of eight-hour days called "Preaching the Kingdom: Preaching and New Testament Exegesis." I showed up that first day like a 6th grader arriving to my first day of middle school. I had my cool backpack (which got stolen out of the same room during my second seminar), my new MacBook Air laptop, courtesy of the Wilshire Pastoral Residency (also stolen), and my new travel coffee mug (which I dropped and bent, but still kept coffee hot).

I was introduced to my Doctor of Ministry (or D.Min) Cohort in that small room with a conference table that snuggly fit all 12 of us, plus two professors. After that first seminar, we felt like our own weird, little family system. Dr. Hulitt Gloer, who is now my academic supervisor for my project, led the preaching component and Dr. Preben Vang, a great Dane and former pastor of First Baptist Copenhagen in Denmark, led our New Testament component.

Coming from a global Christian context, Dr. Vang's study of the cultural particularities behind the New Testament seemed quite foreign in Waco, Texas. Dr. Vang introduced us to the honor/shame cultural backdrop of the New Testament Church. In a world absent of American rugged individualism and European enlightenment rationalism, relationships were the currency that kept society moving. Long before you had a credit score and social security number, all you had was your name and your family's reputation —honorable or shameful — and it was impossible to escape the hand fate dealt you.

Enter Jesus, Paul, and God's dream for one human family. The church became an oasis of belonging in a world of division. Today, we divide in so many ways, but if we are a church family, every story matters and every generation counts. Millennials, X-ers, Boomers, and Builders — we are all the beloved children of God. In Christ, we see the divine spark in each other's eyes, even if everything else about us is different, diverse, and distinct. We are all still created in the same image of the same loving God.

In July, I'll be leading a three-week session on my D.Min project called "Age to Age: An Intergenerational Exploration of Church Family and Faith." During this time, I want to share with you some of my findings that will ultimately find a home in my doctoral project. I hope you will be encouraged and inspired about the future of the Church, because, despite appearances, the Good News is still good and it is still an Easter world.

Also, thank you for supporting me in this academic journey, and thank you for being a great example of church family in a world crying out for connection and belonging. I am honored and grateful to be your pastor.



Friends,

Perhaps the most important role of a deacon at Broadway is participation in one of the four deacon ministry groups. Historically, the groups have been defined as follows:

New Member Group - Greeting new members on the Sunday they join; taking pictures for publication; following up to invite new members to various programs to ensure involvement and inclusion

Homebound Visiting Group - Visiting members who are homebound; sharing requests from those members; taking bouquets from donated Sunday arrangements

Hospital Visiting Group - Visiting members who are hospitalized; sharing requests from the patients.

Transition Care Group – Follow-up with members who have been released from the hospital and have gone home or to a temporary rehabilitation service; call and ask what needs they may have; visit the church member at home or at the rehabilitation facility; share communion with them if they so request.

As technology and medical care advance, we find that often when a member goes into a hospital, the stay is very brief — sometimes the patient is in and out of the hospital before the deacon team is aware or can make arrangements to visit. However, the member may still need support either at home or in rehabilitation, sometimes with a large group of transitional care members. As a result, the deacons have combined the hospital visiting group and the transition care group into a new group called the **Deacon Care Team.**

In brief, the deacons on this new team will be assigned to members as they enter the hospital or have an issue brought to the church's attention which requires support and/or prayer. The deacon care team coordinator will assign the deacons on a rotating basis as needs arise. The deacon assigned will follow the member through any hospital stay and rehabilitation during the following month (or as long as needed). Our goal is to provide support to any and every member as the need arises and to be an extension of the ministry of the church.

Many thanks to all of the deacons for providing input and direction, and especially to Kevin Gardner-Sinclair, Robert Gammon and Ellen Waddle for building the process for the new team. Ellen has also volunteered to be the care team coordinator as we transition throughout the balance of the year.
