2019 Lenten Theme: Traveling a Broader Way

The season of Lent is 40 days in length, not including Sundays (Sundays are days of celebration in the Christian church, and thus are not counted). Lent is a time when we prepare for Easter by observing a period of confession, forgiveness, and spiritual discipline.

The Ash Wednesday service will take place in the chapel at 6p.m. on March 6.

The first Sunday in Lent is March 10. We will begin by traveling to the cross as the choir sings a dramatic anthem entitled "Come to Me" by Dan Forrest.

Our Lenten theme this year is *Traveling a Broader Way*. There will be art work on the worship folder to inspire and enlighten us along our journey. In addition, we will use 8 different crosses as visual aids; as well as the purple Lenten banners and use of burlap around the communion table and large cross. Some of the questions we hope you will consider this lenten season are based on our theme: When and how has Broadway helped or encouraged you to trust God through a difficult season in your life? When and how had God use Broadway to help you heal from a past experience to discover abundant life and love? How does the community of faith at Broadway continue to support you in your spiritual growth?

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Broadway,

We are writing to inform you of a change in our personnel structure. After studying the second Ad Hoc committee report and consulting with the deacons and ministerial staff, the Personnel Committee has voted to move forward with a staff restructure by combining two positions—Church Administrator and Facilities Manager—into a single position: Director of Operations. The reasons for this change are two-fold: we are a different church today with different strategic needs and a different operating budget.

When any staffing model is restructured, there is grief at the loss of colleagues as the change occurs. Don Irvan has been with Broadway for twenty-two years and Betsy Cherry for six years. We could not be more grateful for their service and dedication. Don has kept our campus a warm, functional place of welcome and respite, and for that we give him thanks. Betsy has served as a good steward of our office and finances, and we offer our gratitude for her service.

In this time of transition, we have asked Scott Kimbell to serve as our Interim Director of Operations to oversee the office administration, finances, and facilities. Scott brings with him decades of experience at Anthem, where he served as Vice President of Operations until deciding to retire early and opting to not relocate but stay in Louisville near family, friends, and Broadway. Scott now runs his own consulting business and teaches courses on Leadership at the University of Louisville. This flexibility frees him to be ready and willing to serve his church home during this season of change.

We would like to explicitly assure you, as a church member, Scott will not have access to giving records and contribution statements. We are putting together a plan to ensure continued discretion and confidentiality in your tithes and offerings.

In the coming months, Scott will collaborate with the staff and Personnel Committee to craft a job description inclusive of the necessary functions of the combined position and also to seek additional office and facilities support to balance the load on James, Sarah, and all of the staff. Once the job description is finalized, the Personnel Committee will begin a nationwide search with due diligence to find candidates of the highest quality.


