Beloved Broadway,

What does "fullness" mean to you? The Psalmist in the most well-known portion of Hebrew Scripture writes, "You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows." The old King James translates that Hebrew word ravayeh, "runneth over," another way to say it is to be saturated. This is a different image of how we often think of Lent.

Lent is a season which starts in the desert as Jesus faced three temptations. Not exactly an environment for flourishing. However, there is a grace found in the desert. If you have ever had the pleasure of visiting the Southwest, you have seen the wind-carved canyons and mesas which look like God took a chisel to the earth one sunny afternoon. You would have seen the alien-like vegetation and fauna which have evolved over millions of years to survive the hard, arid conditions. There is a grace out West; it is just that flourishing looks different in a desert than it does in the rolling, green hills of the Bluegrass state. Not better. Not worse, Just different. Fullness looks different for each of us.

This Lent, we are asking this question, "What does a full, flourishing, expansive life look like?" We will reflect together in worship, through devotional guides, and in word and image how God is inviting us to grow, adapt, and flourish this season of Lent. As we begin out Lenten journey together, receive these words of poetic blessing from Rev. Sarah Speed,

From Here in the Sand


