



Five criteria are considered: civic, creative, physical, intellectual and spiritual. The following is part of her nomination, submitted by Mary Jackson. "Dr. Bonnie Metcalf is a teacher and teachers make the best lifelong learners. After teaching 'Materials and Methods of Education' as well as supervising student teachers for many years, Dr. Metcalf became Vice President for Academic Affairs at California Baptist Institute in Riverside.
