### A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Beloved Broadway,

As we continue our search for an Organist, I am grateful for the gifted guests who have sat at the bench to lead us in worship; for the passion and dedication of Robert and our Chancel Choir; for our pianist Jennifer Harberson and her world-class gifts, making the keys sing week by week. We have an embarrassment of riches in our church musicians at Broadway.

The Church lost another giant of church music this past month (Big-C, Church Universal; not littlec, church Broadway). Thomas Troeger died at 77 years of age after a battle with cancer. Dr. Troeger most recently taught with Yale Divinity School, was a Presbyterian minister, and authored dozens of books on preaching, poetry, and countless hymns (three in our hymnal which was published 32 years ago) Dr. Troeger sang his theology and played his faith out loud for all the world to hear.

In one beloved memory of him, the dean of Yale Div, Greg Sterling tells the story about the time Dr. Troeger was lecturing at a local presbytery gathering. Someone asked him about his personal faith and theological convictions, and he replied (Dean Sterling did not recall the actual hymn numbers, mind you) by pointing to the hymnal in the pew, "If you open to hymn #\_\_\_\_\_, you will discover what I believe about creation. If you turn to hymn #\_\_\_\_\_, you will find what I believe about Christology. If you turn to hymn #\_\_\_\_\_, you will read what I have to say about the Holy Spirit." In their last conversation, Troeger told his friend and Dean, "I am dying, but my soul is dancing." The music never seemed to leave him.

Like so many of our beloved church members who have passed from this life into the next, music was the last language they spoke. Long after bedside conversation were no longer possible, whispering "Amazing Grace" or mouthing the words of "Great is Thy Faithfulness" along with their loved one became their very own swan song. Music knits us together like food for our souls.

One of the many facets of Broadway that I cherish is our communal love of music. The collective sound of our voices mingled together makes a sound greater than the sum of the parts. Choral music is, in itself, a miracle, according to the legend of the Medieval musicians crafting Gregorian Chants. A chord is constructed of at least three notes, and once that third note was introduced, a heavenly harmony reverberated off cavern and cathedral walls to create a wholly different holy sound. They believed the angels were joining in the chorus. It is no wonder that Pope Gregory (after whom the chants were named) attributed to St. Augustine the quote, "To sing is to pray twice."

Gathering together to sing means more to me now than ever; certainly after months of trying to sing hymns on the couch in our living room (Gotta stretch out that diaphragm!). The music we share in worship to God becomes a common tongue—a universal language—which we can never replicate or replace without each other. Psalm 133:1 begins like this, "A Song of Ascents. How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity!" That certainly sounds like a song worth singing.

narrow down the source of the silver. As a team, we had decided to have a sealed bid auction to support the Podgaiskys' work with Ukrainians. One of our team members urged us to double-check with the donor family. The donors are not affiliated with Broadway and we didn't even know their names, though we had made many trips to their home.

After a number of phone messages over several days, we finally reached a granddaughter. Her first reaction was that it was probably fine to sell the silver but she wanted to confirm with her mother. It turned out that her mother was thrilled that we had found her grandmother's wedding silver and wanted to keep it. When the granddaughter picked up the box of silver, she brought she brought a check for \$500 to help us support Ukraine. Totally unexpected and still gives me chills. That's how God works sometimes.
