GLOW WITH GOD PARTY!















Beloved Broadway,

As the bulbs of Spring begin to blossom, we continue our lenten path towards the cross and empty tomb of Christ. As a child growing up at Freeman Heights Baptist Church in Garland, Texas (c.f., Arland, Texas in the animated series King of the Hill), we did not observe Lent. I remember my first experience of a Holy Week service at Royal Lane Baptist Church in Dallas while I was a college student. I will never forget how diving deeper into the darkness of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday illuminated the joy of Easter in a whole new way. For my worship practice, walking the lenten path to Easter was like going from black-and-white to technicolor. On the coin of our faith, Easter celebration and Lenten suffering are two sides of discovering a joy that will not wither under the weight of life's challenges. As followers of Jesus, we are a people who know both the reality of Crucifixion and Resurrection.

Franciscan priest Richard Rohr writes of this journey, "Suffering, of course, can lead you in either of two directions: It can make you very bitter and close you down, or it can make you wise, compassionate, and utterly open, either because your heart has been softened, or perhaps because suffering makes you feel like you have nothing more to lose. It often takes you to the edge of your inner resources where you [as Hebrews 10:31 says,] 'fall into the hands of the living God,' even against your will." While we do not control what the day brings, we monitor and manage our inner life and our response. As the Irish poet Bono once sang, "What am I supposed to do? What am I supposed to say? I can't change the world, but I can change the world in me. I rejoice..."

This Lent, we are sitting with the stories of Simon Peter. By looking at the life of this brash, boisterous ex-fisherman, we are holding a mirror up to ourselves. Certainly, some of us are more quiet, more reflective, more anchored than others. However, if I were a bettin' man, I would bet that everyone one of us has a little "unbridled spirit," inside of us (and not in that good Kentucky way). Each of us are a work in progress, and with that inevitably comes growing edges. We are not perfect, and even if we were, what a graceless life perfection would be?

Lent, Holy Week, and Easter are a seasonal reminder to us of two things: 1) Christ is risen once and for all proclaiming that all things are becoming new (Revelation 21:1-5), and that 2) as Jesus' disciples we perpetually live in a cycle of Crucifixion and Resurrection (2 Corinthians 4:7-10). Resurrection assures us that there will be a good, just, and peaceful end to the Story, and Crucifixion reminds us that we are not at the end of the Story yet.

When we find ourselves in the midst of suffering, may we be reminded by this season that after Crucifixion comes Resurrection. And when we are riding high on the hog, and things seem to be falling into place, may we also remind ourselves that we are not promised an easy life, but only in suffering and rebirth will we discover a good life. For this reason, I cling to the wise words of the Rev. Dr. William Sloan Coffin, "Despite appearances, it is an Easter world."

Wherever we find ourselves today, in Crucifixion or Resurrection, may we find the courage to hold the tension between both sides of the coin and say, "This, too, shall pass," while also saying, "Thank you, God, for the gift of today."
